

What is your party's vision for the UN?

Dear Party Leader,

The United Nations Association – UK (UNA-UK) is a non-partisan grassroots movement with over 20,000 supporters across all four nations of the UK. We write on their behalf to seek a dedicated statement outlining your position on the United Nations ahead of the General Election.

Our movement is diverse – spanning all ages, ethnicities and political affiliations. What they share is the recognition that all British citizens benefit greatly from our international system, from laws that protect our rights and environment, to institutions that deal with conflict, mass migration and humanitarian crises. They know that what happens in other countries matters to their own lives, and they believe that the UK can be a global force for good.

But they are deeply concerned that British policy-makers have underestimated the need to invest in our international institutions – particularly the UN, which is essential to solving the problems we face. The UK needs to start taking pride in the international system it did so much to create and public support for this agenda is crucial.

Political parties have an important role to play, including by speaking up about the ways the UN benefits people in this country. What would your Party's priorities be at the UN and how will you inspire the UK electorate on this agenda?

We commit to publishing and alerting our nationwide supporter-base to your response, alongside those of all other major UK political parties. By doing so, we aim to contribute to an informed national conversation on foreign policy ahead of the 12 December General Election.
